How to Move Around

Local Trains: Mumbai's suburban railway network, commonly known as the local trains, is the lifeline of the city, connecting different suburbs and areas. Divided into Western, Central, and Harbour lines, local trains are a fast and economical way to travel within the city and its outskirts. BEST Buses: The Brihanmumbai Electric Supply and Transport (BEST) buses cover an extensive network of routes across Mumbai. With affordable fares and frequent services, buses are a convenient option for getting around the city, especially for shorter distances and areas not covered by trains.

Metro: Mumbai's metro network is expanding rapidly, offering a comfortable and efficient mode of transportation for commuters. Currently, the Mumbai Metro operates on the Versova-Andheri-Ghatkopar corridor, with plans for further expansion to connect different parts of the city. Taxis and Auto-rickshaws: Black-and-yellow taxis and auto-rickshaws are readily available throughout Mumbai and provide a convenient door-to-door transportation option. While taxis run on metered fares, auto-rickshaws often require negotiation for the fare before the journey.

Ride-Hailing Services: App-based ride-hailing services like Uber and Ola operate extensively in Mumbai, offering on-demand transportation with the convenience of booking rides through mobile applications. **Ferries**: Ferries and boats connect Mumbai to its nearby islands and coastal areas. They provide scenic rides and are an alternative mode of transportation for destinations like Elephanta Island, Alibaug, and Mandwa.
